# Curtis Friends Annual Report November 1, 2021 – October 30, 2022

Twice-Told Tales bookstore opened in July of 2015 at its first location on Pleasant Street, Brunswick. In the fall of 2019, we moved to our current location at 200 Maine Street. The bookstore is operated by the Friends of Curtis Memorial Library with two goals: providing quality used books at reasonable prices to our community and financially supporting programs at Curtis Library.

COVID protocols had a diminishing impact on day-to-day operations this year. The Town of Brunswick instituted a mandatory masking requirement on 10 January, then eased that requirement to "recommended" on 23 February. Many of our customers voiced their appreciation that all of our staff continued to wear masks. As summer approached, CDC guidelines no longer required mandatory mask wearing and most stores in town, as well as the library, no longer required masks. In view of this change, the Curtis Friends Board, on 22 August 2022, voted unanimously to rescind mandatory mask wearing. This change was well-received by our customers as a return to normalcy. People still concerned are free to wear masks and we continue to make masks available at the front desk at no charge.

Because COVID has eased and protocols were well-managed, Twice-Told Tales was able to remain open for a full year without any extended closures for the first time since our initial opening in 2015. This was reflected in our record donations to the library for the fiscal year ending 30 April 2022. Now that COVID protocols have eased, we hope to be able to resume hosting special events in the future such as the Friends' Appreciation event.

Areas of Operation breakdown into the following divisions: Storefront, Volunteers, Membership, Sorting Room, Online Sales, and Publicity.

**STOREFRONT** is a somewhat slippery term that describes which and where books are put on view on the shelves and in the windows of the bookstore. These decisions are made to maximize the number of books that can be displayed, together with the attractiveness, ease of access and timeliness of their availability. The windows are frequently refreshed to maximize visual interest and to acknowledge timely events, as in this year's losses of Colin Powell, David McCullough and Queen Elizabeth II.

MODS and their volunteers frequently propose adjustments in categories or locations within the store. For example, for authors whose books fall into a number of different categories this

year we dedicated a series of shelves to ECLECTIC AUTHORS so that customers were spared from having to search in several possible locations. Additionally, with an eye to the tourist trade, we dedicated a set of shelves to CURRENT MAINE AUTHORS, living writers who spend at least part of their year in Maine. Volunteers are encouraged to "adopt" a genre to curate, periodically culling titles that have evoked no interest, incorporating newly arrived items, and double-checking appropriate alphabetization.

One of the Storefront team's major responsibilities is to propose **Special Sales**, both monthlong sales or shorter Pop-Ups, decisions based on categories that have become especially crowded or to coincide with specific holidays or events. As always during the summer months the eye-catching Blue Cart is placed on the sidewalk, attractively displaying books by popular mystery/thriller and romance writers.

An abbreviated summary of the Special Sales is as follows:

**November 2021**: 20% off all regularly-priced Oddballs, Humor, Games, Puzzles and Needlework. In conjunction with BDA Early Bird Shopping Event "Draw Your Own Discount" all day (November 13, 10% - 50% all day)

**December 2021**: No special sales but promoted Gift Certificates

**January 2022**: (first two weeks) 50% off Biographies and Memoirs; (second two weeks) 50% off Fiction, including Mystery and Sci-Fi

February 2022: 50% off Short Stories, poetry, plays/drama, essays and letters

March 2022: 50% off Travel Guides and Travel Writing; also, Science and Nature

April 2022: 50% off Gardening, Music and Poetry

May 2022: Fiction 50% off Pop-Up, Adult and Teen, from May 6 to 21

**June 2022**: Outside Blue Beach Reads cart appears - \$1 hardcover, 50 cent paperbacks; no other Special Sales


July 2022: Continually replenished Blue Cart constitutes only sale

**August 2022**: Annual Teachers' Appreciation Sale 50% off all children's, parenting and education books for teachers and home-schooling parents

**September 2022**: Pop-Up sale (9<sup>th</sup> through 17<sup>th</sup>) – 50% off Science, Nature and Animals. Pop-Up sale (23<sup>rd</sup> through Oct. 1)- 50% off Biographies and Memoirs. Blue sales cart continues.

October 2022: Pop-Up Sale (10th-22<sup>nd</sup>) 50% off Classical CDS and Performing Arts

**Volunteers:** We are extremely fortunate to have 46 capable and dedicated volunteers to manage the front of the store, the sorting room and the On-Line office. We are open six hours a day, six days a week. Three volunteers fill each of the two shifts per day in the storefront, at least one volunteer per day sorts and cleans donated books, and several people manage the online office here in the store every day and a few people help do research from home. The storefront volunteers stock the shelves with new arrivals, greet and help customers find books they are searching for or suggest good books for new literary adventures. They also tote all the bags and boxes of donations from the front of the store to the back where they are processed, sorted, and cleaned. Our volunteers' friendly spirit of helpfulness and enthusiasm for literature keeps our customers returning regularly.

**Membership:** The Curtis Friends group was established to provide financial support programs at Curtis Memorial Library. The Friends holds an annual membership drive with appeal letters sent out in June each year. In 2021-2022 over 200 community members joined the organization. With their generous donations, the Friends were able to increase our donations to the library by a significant amount. The membership drive for 2022-2023 is off to a good start and we hope to increase the number of members this year.

**Sorting Room:** A dedicated group of volunteers works in the sorting room evaluating donations, cleaning books, and sorting them by genre to be shelved in the front of the store. They take pride in assuring that books are clean and in good condition. Books that cannot be sold in the store are often donated to other nonprofit organizations such as Goodwill. The sorting room volunteers are a vital part of the store's operation although this part of the process is not often visible to customers.

**Online sales** make up a significant part of Twice-Told Tales revenue. The Online committee volunteers first evaluate donations of books, music CDs, and audio books. Subsequently the group lists selected items, ships the sold items, and electronically tracks the process.

At times it is overwhelming to see donations pour into the store, but the fact of the matter is that donations are our lifeblood. Every donation is evaluated for condition, appropriateness, and saleability when it is received. Obvious items that are not listable online are moved onto the next phase of the process: cleaning and sorting. Books with ISBN's are electronically scanned and listing candidates identified. Older books without ISBNs are manually evaluated against the sites that sell books online. These books are then listed on either Amazon or ABE. The listing often consists of meeting or beating the price of existing similar items that are for sale. More esoteric items can take extra research both to evaluate them and then to describe them to potential buyers. All items we list must have a picture, either the stock image offered

by the listing site or our own photo which we add to the listing. All listed items are then shelved in the online sales area. Occasionally visits are made to the homes of individuals in possession of a large number of potentially listable books.

The goal of listing items obviously is to sell them, so the whole online selling process is important. Packing items securely, shipping them in a timely manner, and providing tracking information to the buyer are essential parts of the process. Additionally, appropriate interactions with buyers, potential buyers, and the listing sites may also be necessary. Adhering to the best practices of bookselling adds to our reputation as dependable professionals in the trade.

Finally, we maintain an electronic inventory of every item we have ever listed online. When items are sold, this inventory is updated with the sale information. Monthly summaries of the new and sold listings are provided to the Curtis Friends Board of Directors. The monthly summaries compare the current month to previous months as well as to the previous year in order to show any trends, either positive or negative.

One challenge that the online sales group has had is that we are always listing more books than we sell. Over time this has obviously stressed the storage space that we have upstairs. In the past year, we have added a couple of bookcases and have moved large books and CDs to the upstairs area behind our standard space. This room, which is above the downstairs non-fiction section, is affectionately called the 'cold storage room' since it has no heat (nor air conditioning). A generous donation of four double-sided and double-wide bookcases from the library facilitated this effort. We are currently in the process of moving sets into that area as well, having received a donation of three bookcases. This will free up more space in the standard shelving rooms, but eventually our storage needs must be addressed in a more permanent manner.

A bold new sandwich board stands prominently on the sidewalk in front of the store stating "20,000+ Books, 4 Rooms, Kid's Area, Low Prices" to all passers-by.

Every Friday, the Twice-Told Tales news column appears in the Curtis Memorial Library eBlasts. Along with store information, fun facts, and current Twice-Told Tales sales details, the "Who Said It?" book-related brainteaser is an eye-catching and very popular weekly feature. Almost 7000 recipients also receive our monthly Twice-Told Tales emails with information about the store and our sales. Event flyers and emails announcing our special Pop-Up Sales are sent out as they happen.

Touting all that the bookstore has to offer, a bright visual Twice-Told Tales display is greeting travelers arriving at the Brunswick Visitor's Center during the months of September and October 2022. Twice-Told Tales is also listed on the Brunswick Re-Sale Trail Map that is distributed at every Downeaster train station from Brunswick to Boston with information about vintage and resale businesses in downtown Brunswick. This map is handed out to interested customers at all the resale businesses in Brunswick as well.

This year, we have ordered roomy new Twice-Told Tales book bags with our logo and address printed on the front. Beautiful and sturdy with space for plenty of books, they promote Twice-Told Tales far and wide. We are selling them at the store for just \$15 and they have been very popular. We also have new Twice-Told Tales information bookmarks which are given out to customers in the store and are included with the receipt in all of our online sales.

Social media continues to introduce the bookstore to new audiences. Our twice weekly posts on our Twice-Told Tales Facebook page have accumulated almost 12,000 views over the course of the year and 187 people have become new TTT followers in that time. Seventeen satisfied customers have also taken the time to award us enthusiastic 5-star reviews on Google Reviews with comments like: "Super friendly staff, well organized, books are all clean and in great condition." We are seeing requests on Google Maps for directions to Twice-Told Tales coming from all around the state. The word about Twice-Told Tales is spreading!
